Bible Quiz Game - Genesis 1-11

Objectives:	Review what you have learned in Genesis 1-11 Have fun with your family!
Number of Players:	3 - or more; 1 person to ask the questions and keep score; 2 or more people to be the contestants; first 2 contestants will play against each other;
Length:	5 - 30 minutes, add or subtract rounds to fit your time-frame
Set up:	Arrange a place for 2 contestants to stand or sit side by side (the 2 hot seats). Another person will ask a series of questions and keep score. Each right answer will come with 5 points. The question is asked and the contestant must ring a bell or slap the surface of the table to indicate they want to answer. The first contestant to ring the bell gets to answer the question. If they answer correctly, they will receive 5 points and be allowed to remain in the competition. If the contestant answers incorrectly, their opponent will then have the opportunity to answer correctly and earn the 5 points. You can give a time limit for them to answer. The contestant who answered incorrectly must move out of the hot seat and another contestant will take their place. If a question is asked that neither contestant knows the answer for, then another family member may challenge by raising their hand--if they answer the question correctly they will replace the contestant with the least amount of points. After 5 questions, rotate out the contests in the hot seats with those family members who are waiting to play (this will allow everyone to have a chance to play.) The answers are on page 3. You can add a level of difficulty by requiring the bible verse reference with the answer, or by adding a time element (5 seconds per question). You can make it easier by having contestants work in teams, or by allowing them to use their Bibles.

Question One: Who was the first person to die in Genesis?

Question Two: What tree did God tell Adam and Eve not to eat from?

Question Three: What was the first great catastrophe in nature?

Question Four: Who was a son of Noah and a brother to Shem and Ham?

Question Five: Who is the oldest man on record?

Question Six: How old was Methuselah when he died?

Question Seven: Who did not die, but walked with God and was "taken?"

Question Eight: Which land did Cain wander to?

Question Ten: What was the first bird that Noah sent out of the ark?

Question Eleven: What bird did Noah send out of the ark who came back because she found no rest for the sole of her foot?

Question Twenty-one: When the dove returned to the ark the second time, what did it carry in it’s mouth?

Question Twenty-two: What was the length of the ark?

Question Twenty-three: How many of each clean animal went into the ark?

Question Twenty-four: How many people were in the ark?

Question Twenty-five: How long did it rain?

Question Twenty-six: What was the ark made of?

Question Twenty-seven: Who closed the door of the ark?

Question Twenty-eight: How old was Noah when the flood came?

Question Twenty-nine: Who told Noah to leave the ark?

Question Thirty: What was the name of the city where a tall tower was built?

Final Round: Prayer. Have one person open in prayer thanking God for creation. Then pray for the person on your right. Going clockwise continue around the circle praying for the person on your right until everyone has been prayed for.
